PROSPECT CALF

- Prospect calves must be ID'd with a 4-H eartag by May 15, but do not have to be from a cow/calf project.
- Classes for heifers and steers will be judged as market beef prospects.
- Prospect market steers must be castrated (NO bull calves).
- Prospect calves must be weaned (NO nurse cows).

MARKET BEEF

DAIRY STEER

Requirements:

NEW IN 2010: - A CROSSBRED DAIRY STEER Division has been added. Crossbred Dairy Steers must be from the following breeds in any combination: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, Milking Shorthorn, Montebeliarde, Normande, Red & White Holsteins, Norwegian Red and Viking Red (Swedish, Danish & Finnish Red).

- Recommended minimum weight for State Fair is 1,000 pounds; maximum weight is 1,600 pounds. Market animals exceeding the maximum weight will not be eligible for State fair.

- Pure Breed Dairy Steers must be 100% of one of the following Dairy Breeds to be accepted in the STATE Fair dairy steer show: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein and Jersey.

- Dairy Steers showing permanent teeth may be shown, but they can place no higher than a red ribbon and they will not be eligible for State Fair or auction.

Note: A special award is given to the top dairy steer.

- All dogs must be vaccinated according to the requirements listed on the MN 4-H Dog Project Identification Form and Vaccination Verification – Dog IDA.
- A dog may be shown in the Dog Show or brought to the Pets Judge, but not both.

DOG AGILITY

Z – 1 – 1*	Beginner

DOG OBEDIENCE

Z – 2 – 1 BEGINNERS CLASS - "A" - A 4-H'er and his/her dog who is in his/her first year of training at home or in an organized class. The 4-H'er may participate in this class only once during their 4-H career. All exercises will be performed on leash. Exercises include heel on leash & figure eight, stand for exam, grooming, recall and long sit/down. A dog entering this class with more than ten (10) weeks of training prior to enrolling in beginner level training classes for 4-H is ineligible. A dog having achieved one leg of its AKC-CD (or its equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 2 BEGINNER CLASS - "B" - A 4-H'er having previous obedience training experience but who is working with a new dog or a dog with previous experience in an organized training class, working with a new 4-H'er. All exercises will be performed on leash. Exercises include heel on leash & figure eight, stand for exam, grooming, recall and long sit/down. The 4-H'er working with the same dog may participate in this class for only one year. A dog having achieved one leg of its AKC-CD is ineligible.

** A 4-H member may train in either Beginner A or Beginner B for only one year. The 4-H member must then advance to the Graduate Beginner Class (or higher class). Members do not advance from Beginner A to Beginner B.

** A 4-H member using a dog which has previously been shown through the Novice Class shall begin training in the Graduate Beginner,

regardless of the age of the 4-H member.

Z – 2 – 3 GRADUATE BEGINNER – Exercises include heel on leash & figure eight, stand for exam off leash, grooming, recall off leash, long sit/down off leash. A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog having achieved one leg of its AKC-CD (or its equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 4 NOVICE CLASS - Exercises include heel on leash & figure eight, stand for exam off leash, heel free, recall off leash, long sit/down off leash. A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog having achieved one leg of its CD (or its equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 5 GRADUATE NOVICE CLASS – Exercises include heel on leash, stand for exam off leash, heel free & figure eight, moving drop on recall, willing retrieve from hand, and out of sight sits/downs. A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog with one leg of its AKC-CDX (or equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 6 PRE-OPEN – All exercises are performed off leash. Exercises include heel free & figure eight, drop on recall, dumbbell recall, recall over broad jump, and out of sight sits/downs. A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog with an AKC-CDX (or equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 7 OPEN – All exercises are performed off leash. Exercises include heel free & figure eight, drop on recall, retrieve on flat, retrieve over high jump, broad jump, and out of sight sits/downs. A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog with an AKC-CDX (or equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 8 GRADUATE OPEN - All exercises are performed off leash. Exercises include signal exercise (with 10 foot distance for down, sit, come), retrieve on flat for placed metal article, retrieve on flat for placed leather article, directed retrieve (with two gloves), broad jump, and moving stand and exam. A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog with an AKC-CDX (or equivalent) is ineligible.

Z – 2 – 9 PRE UTILITY - All exercises are performed off leash. Exercises include signal exercise (at full distance), scent discrimination (with 2 metal and 2 leather articles), directed retrieve (with all three gloves), moving stand and

exam, and directed jumping (with heel out) A 4-H'er and dog may participate in this class until receiving a blue ribbon at the county or state show level. A dog with an AKC-CDX (or equivalent) is ineligible. Additionally, if a 4-H member participated in the Utility obedience class in 2003 and did NOT receive a blue ribbon at the county or state show, they may drop back to the Pre Utility class for 2004.

Z – 2 – 10 UTILITY – All exercises are performed off leash. Exercises include signal exercise, scent discrimination, directed retrieve, moving stand and exam, and directed jumping. There are no restrictions in this class. A 4-H'er may participate in this class with the same dog indefinitely.

Z – 2 – 11 VETERANS OBEDIENCE CLASS is for dogs that are too old and/or unfit to jump. Dogs must be at least seven years old. Dogs must be trained through the Graduate Novice (or higher) level. If a dog under the age of seven years has been found unfit to jump (broad jump and high jump) by a licensed, practicing veterinarian, it will be allowed to compete in this class. If entered in this Veterans Obedience Class, the participating dog will not be allowed to compete in any other obedience class other than Brace and Four Dog Team. Participation in agility will also not be permitted. Showmanship participation is permitted and encouraged. Once a dog competes in Veterans at the county show level, it can never again be shown in any agility class or other obedience class (other than Brace and Four Dog Team), even if being trained and exhibited by another 4-H'er. The Novice scorecard will be used for judging. A 4-H'er may participate in this class with the same dog indefinitely.

Z – 2 – 12 BRACE – For a 4-H'er with two dogs of their own or those who wish to borrow/lease a dog if they do not have two dogs of their own. (A third dog may not be used for Brace.) No particular level of training is required or prohibited in this class. The Graduate Beginner score sheet will be used for judging. A 4-H'er may participate in this class indefinitely.

Z – 2 – 13 FOUR DOG TEAM: For 4-H'ers wishing to work together in training their dogs to perform as a unit of four. No particular level of training is required or prohibited in this class. Exercises include heel on leash & figure eight, stand for exam off leash, team uniformity, recall off leash, long sit/down off leash. Dogs will be called simultaneously. The Four Dog Team score sheet will be used for judging. One alternate is allowed to be named if the team desires. The alternate must be named at the county fair or qualifying show. The five names

may be registered as exhibitors, as long as one of the five names is listed as the alternate. 4-H members may only be listed on one team each year. No substitutions may be made. For teams qualifying for the State Dog Show, the registration fee is charged for four exhibitors. The named alternate may compete in place of one of the original four team members.

Z – 2 – 14 TRAINING AT HOME CLASS - This class is limited only to members and dogs who have not participated in any organized obedience training classes. Participants in this class will not be eligible for State Show.

DOG SHOWMANSHIP

Z – 3 – 1 JUNIOR NOVICE SHOWMANSHIP -

The 4-H member must be entering 4th through 8th grade. Judged entirely on the member's ability to groom and show their dog by breed standards of that dog. A crossbred dog should be shown and groomed by the breed standard it resembles. Conformation of the dog is not evaluated in showmanship.

Z – 3 – 2 JUNIOR OPEN SHOWMANSHIP -

After the 4-H member has achieved a blue ribbon in Junior Novice Showmanship, at the county level, they must move to this class until achieving the age requirements for the Senior Novice division.

Z – 3 – 3 SENIOR NOVICE SHOWMANSHIP -

The 4-H member should have completed 9th grade through age 19. Judged entirely on the member's ability to groom and show their dog by breed standard of that dog. A crossbred dog should be shown and groomed by the breed standard it resembles. Conformation of the dog is not evaluated in showmanship.

Z – 3 – 4 SENIOR OPEN SHOWMANSHIP -

After the 4-H member has achieved a blue ribbon in Senior Novice Showmanship, at the county level, they must move to this class.

This policy also extends to 4-H volunteers when they are working with 4-H youth in a 4-H volunteer role during mounted activities.

- Your horse must be identified on a 4-H identification form by May 16 at the county Extension office. The horse must be member or family owned, or leased. Members of the same family may SHARE a horse, but CANNOT show the same horse in the same events. Members may show a mare or gelding only.

You may not show 2 game horses. All pleasure classes the exhibitor participates in, must be shown with the same horse (halter, western, English, and trail). In addition, a 4-H'er can exhibit two horses in the Horse Training Class if one of the horses is at level five or higher.

TO EARN A STATE 4-H HORSE TRIP:

GAME POINTS:

- State Fair points will be on overall times of grades 6-12+. Points will be tabulated in all four events, (barrels, poles, jumping figure 8, key race) with the most points earning the State Fair trip.
- A broken pattern will be an elimination (for that event) and a knockdown of a barrel, pole, or jump

will be a 5 second penalty.

- Points will be awarded, with the fastest time earning 10 points. This is for grades 6-12+. Even though you can show two horses, you can pick only one for a State Fair trip. Please have your decision by Friday of County Fair if you can take your State Fair trip or not.
